ROSIE & ELVIS

2015 went out with a bang, with 20 Cavaliers arriving in December alone! That brought the year-end total to 119, the most in one year since GCCR's inception in 2005.

The youngest arrived in utero when their mom was rescued from an Ohio commercial kennel in August. Three lucky and beautiful pups were born into freedom the following month!

Expenses in 2015 topped \$107,000 (another record) due to the upsurge in rescued dogs. Fergie, Rosie, and Jody each had surgery in January, tapping the <u>Critical Care Fund</u> for nearly \$6500. Our sincere *thanks* to the generous donors who made these surgeries possible.





How and When to Induce Vomiting in Your Pet



Undeniably, it's not a lovely subject, but if your Cavalier has swallowed something potentially toxic, this information could make the difference between life and death. In this <u>article/video</u>, Dr. Karen Becker explains
