# POLO, CEDAR, & MILLY UPDATES



Remember **Polo**, **Cedar**, and **Milly**, aka "the heart pups"? All three arrived with Pulmonic Stenosis (PS). **Polo** had successful balloon valvuloplasty and is enjoying life in his "furever" home!

**Solo Cedar Milly Cedar** had two unsuccessful attempts at the same procedure and both were stopped due to heart arrhythmia. While receiving cardiac medications to partially help his condition, a caring and compassionate family made a generous donation to give Cedar one more chance. On November 16 Cedar's procedure was a success with only mild arrhythmia! He's happily recovering with his foster family.

In addition to PS, **Milly** also has a hole in her heart that we had hoped would heal so she could have the same procedure. Surprisingly, the cardiologist determined that each medical condition compliments the other and is keeping Milly's heart strong for the time being. She has a doting foster (maybe "furever"?) mom who will see that she has regular cardiac checkups. Three cheers for three Cavaliers!

### KATIE, TEAGON, AND KEATON



A caravan of Cavaliers, navigated by Tammy and Helen, arrived at Ohio State Veterinary Medical Center in mid November. Six-year-old **Katie** was tested and treated for deafness, but several other medical issues were found, including Mitral Valve Disease and retinal atrophy. Eight-month-old **Teagon** had surgery to correct her PDA and will have a 3-month recovery under the watchful eyes of her fosters. **Keaton** was examined by a cardiologist who confirmed Pulmonary Stenosis but Keaton does NOT have aortic insufficiency and ASD as originally thought! He'll have balloon catheter surgery this week.
